Engaging in drawing, colouring, and crafting enhances fine motor skills, laying the groundwork for academic development such as writing and problem-solving. Art also promotes cognitive growth by encouraging critical thinking and decision-making. Exposure to various art styles and cultural traditions builds appreciation and awareness of global perspectives. Most importantly, showcasing their artwork in an exam setting fosters a sense of accomplishment, boosting children's confidence and inspiring continued creative exploration.

Each child's work is evaluated with compassion and encouragement, focusing on growth, effort, and expression rather than technical mastery alone.

- 2. Make an outline with a black sketch pen only.

Types of Shapes Regular Shapes

- All sides are the same size.
- All corners look the **same**.

Examples:

Square (like a tile)




Triangle (like a pizza slice)



Circle (like a ball)

We use basic shapes to create drawings.

1. A house: A combination of square shape and a triangle shape





2. A tree: A combination of rectangle and triangle shape



Irregular Shapes


- Sides are **not all the same**.
- Corners can look different.

These shapes are asymmetrical. We find free flowing, irregular shapes in nature like a leaf, a cloud, a flower, a rock, a tree branch, a road, water waves etc.






