Sample papers explain the type of questions asked in the exam. A brief introduction on Lines is given below.

A line is a moving mark from one point to another. It can be straight, curved, zigzag, wavy, or dotted—going in any direction. Artists use lines to form shapes, patterns, pictures, and express movement, direction, or emotions. Different line types include:



• **Zigzag** – Shape angles, like lightning



• Wavy – Flowing up and down, like waves



• **Dotted** – Made of small dots





Lines can be combined to create varied and expressive artworks.





• Straight – Goes in one direction without bending.







Diagonal

Types of Straight Lines:

1. Horizontal Line

This line goes **side to side**, like the ground or a bed.

2. Vertical Line

This line goes up and down, like a tree trunk or a flagpole.

3. Diagonal Line

This line **slants**, like a slide or a leaning ladder.

• **Curved** – Smooth bends, like a rainbow

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


