Each child's work is evaluated with compassion and encouragement, focusing on growth, effort, and expression rather than technical mastery alone.

We will guide the student but creativity and colouring is the choice of the student.

We have provided sample drawings only as examples to guide the students. However, we do not expect students to copy these examples. Instead, we encourage them to explore their own ideas and create unique drawings.

Our exam for STD 3 is based on 2D Design and colours mainly.

Note:

- 1. Colour with poster colors/oil pastels/colour pencils (Any make)
- 2. Make an outline with a black sketch pen only.

Criteria for Assessment

Sample papers explain the type of questions asked in the exam.

A brief introduction on 2D Design is given below.



- **2D Design** means making art or pictures that are flat like paper or a computer screen. We use shapes, lines, colors to make something look nice they only have length and width, like a piece of paper. The "2D" stands for two-dimensional.
- 1. To create a 2 D design, we use only 2 D shapes. It may be geometrical or decorative shapes.
 - e. g. circle, triangle, floral, leaf, square etc.
- 2. We use different types of lines.
 - e. g. straight lines, curved lines, wavy lines.
- 3. To color the design, we use different color schemes.
- · Primary colour scheme (red, blue, yellow)
- · Secondary colour scheme (Orange, Green, purple)
- Opposite/contrast/complementary colour scheme
- 1. Red x Green
- 2. Blue x Orange
- 3. Yellow x Purple
- Warm and Cool Colours
- 1. Warm colours are colours that remind us of heat and sunshine. These include red, orange, and yellow. They feel bright, happy, and energetic.
- 2. Cool colours remind us of water, sky, and shade. These include blue, green, and purple. They feel calm, peaceful, and relaxing. Artists use warm and cool colours to show feelings and create different moods in their artwork.
- 4. Principle of 2 d designs:
- Pattern: Repeating shapes or colours to create a design.
- Overlapping: Placing shapes or lines on top of each other


